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Prohibited Waste

The Town will not accept the following waste:

Asbestos, fish waste (commercial) septic/sewage sludge, chemical waste (ie. Carcinogenic, infectious, radioactive, poisonous, etc). Tires, oil/gasoline, propane tanks (20lbs or more).

Hours of Operation

Saturdays 9:00a.m. - 4:00 p.m.

User Fees

No tipping fees will apply to residents and businesses of Port Blandford. Any regular outside user will continue to pay annual fees. Tipping fees will apply to one time/part time users, such as cabin/cottage owners living outside the municipal boundary.

Special Circumstances

Businesses in the Food & Beverage industry will have more access to the waste disposal site. They may obtain a key at the Town Office, and are required to dispose of waste properly. Failure to do so may result in a loss of privilege.

Privileges may be granted to building contractors, renovators, demolishers etc. Only after contacting the Town Office. Waste must be separated and disposed of properly. Failure to do so may result in a loss of privilege.

Waste Separation

All waste entering the waste disposal site will have to be separated prior to arrival by the owner of the waste. This includes residents, businesses and contractors. Waste will not be received by the attendance if it is not properly separated.

Metals

Includes hot water tanks, scrap metal, stoves, refrigerators, etc. To your left as you enter the separation site.

Car Wrecks

Includes cars, trucks, vans, etc. All oil, gasoline/diesel, and other lubricants and fluids are to be removed prior to disposal. Oil tanks must have absolutely no oil left in tank.

Compost

Includes leaves, grass clippings, brush, saw dust, etc. Residents may collect these items for use in their home compost bins.

Wood/Lumber

Includes firewood, lumber, scrap lumber etc. Residents may use this wood for personal use.

Furniture

Includes sofas, mattresses, suitcases, lawn chairs, tables, etc. Parts of these items may be salvaged and resorted.

Household Hazardous

Includes paint cans containing paint, batteries, small propane cylinders, etc.

Landfill

Includes household waste (table garbage), concrete, shingles, felt, geoprok, cardboard, glass.

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
